



Dogwood Glen Trail & Salthouse Branch Park Trail Map #3

General Information:

Salthouse Branch Park in addition to hiking also offers camping, swimming, boating, and picnicking. All the trails offer excellent opportunities to see song birds, deer, squirrels, waterfowl, or even a black bear. It offers access to 3 main trails: SHB Nature Trail, a short loop trail; Roland Branch Interpretive Trail approximately 4/10 of a mile one way with points of interest along the trail identified with numbered markers which correspond to interpretive information in the trail guide found at the park; and Dogwood Glen Trail, a 4.5 mile (one way) shared-use trail. Dogwood Glen Trail is moderate to strenuous in difficulty, approximately 7 feet wide in most places, and traverses through beautiful hardwood forests from Philpott Dam to Salthouse Branch Park. The trail can be accessed from Philpott Dam or Salthouse Branch Park.

Directions to Trailhead:

***Dam trail head from intersection of 220 S and Sontag Road (SR 619):** Take US 220S for 13 miles, then slight right onto Oak Level Road for 1.5 miles, then right onto Philpott Drive (SR 674) for 4.2 miles (you will cross railroad tracks and a creek), then right onto Stoneybrook Lane (SR 727). Stoneybrook Lane becomes Riverbrook Road. Continue about 2.5 miles to park entrance.

*** Directions to Salthouse Branch Park from intersection of 220 and Henry Road:** Go 6.8 miles west on Henry Road, then left onto Knob Church Road. Go 1.4 miles, then left onto Salthouse Branch Road. Go 0.8 miles to park entrance.
