Draft improvement recommendations will be available at the meetings and input provided by the public will be considered as recommendations for the study are finalized. The area of the study is generally bounded by Route 220 to the west, Route 40 to the south, Route 29 to the east and Route 460 to the north.

Input from the community, especially those who travel or live and work within the Smith Mountain Lake area is extremely important to the success of the study.

The meetings will be held in an “open house” format and the public is encouraged to come any time between 4:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.
