Course Fee: \$708.00 USD (includes text while all other fees, e.g. drug screening and testing fees, will be the responsibility of the student.

Reimbursement: Upon successful program completion and state certification, those providers affiliated with an EMS agency may be eligible for \$408.00 USD in reimbursement from the Virginia Office of EMS.

Course Application Notations:

1. **Must** take the *COMPASS test* at VWCC and submit results with application.
2. **This class** will be competitively seated using a selection process approved by the Franklin County Public Safety Training Center Advisory Board. If you are not selected, your monies will be refunded in full.
3. **Completed application and tuition** must be received by deadline date to be considered for seating in the class.

Students accepted into this program are eligible to receive college course credit from Virginia Western Community College upon successful completion of each module as assigned by VCCS .

Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate

Program Description

The Franklin County Public Safety Training Center's EMT-Intermediate Program consists of college level educational experience for a student that provides the prospective of Emergency Medical Technician- Intermediate care with specific skills to provide ALS treatment to patients with traumatic injuries and medical conditions.

The EMT-Intermediate may initiate and maintain any and all Basic Life Support (BLS), initiate intravenous infusions, administer intravenous, subcutaneous and intramuscular medications based upon local medical protocols. Additional skills in advanced airway management and advanced patient assessment are also included in the Program.

The Program Courses were developed utilizing topic outlines from the National Standard Curriculum for the EMT-Intermediate. Topics covered in these Courses include: roles and responsibilities, human systems, patient assessment, shock and fluid therapy, pharmacology, advanced care for various medical emergencies from respiratory to environmental, and advanced care of soft tissue and musculoskeletal injuries. Critical skills necessary to provide advanced coronary care to victims of Acute Coronary Syndromes (ACS) and Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) are also provided. The entire Program will be overseen by a Course Medical Director.

The Franklin County Public Safety Training Center EMT-Intermediate Courses are conducted as a single Program, enrolling students at the EMT-Basic level and progressing directly to final EMT-Intermediate certification eligibility. Providers with EMT-Shock Trauma, EMT-Enhanced, and EMT-Cardiac, upon admission to the Program, will be expected to attend and successfully complete an entire Program Course for any certification processes to be attempted.

The EMT-Intermediate Program requires extensive walking, stooping, bending, pushing, pulling, climbing stairs, and lifting. Lifting and carrying requirements: at least 125 pounds (56.8 Kg); motor coordination is necessary. Further, extensive use of sight, hearing, and speech is required as defined by the Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services, Requirements for admission to Advanced Life Support Training Programs.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

1. You must be at least 18 years of age by the beginning of the Program.
2. You must have a high school diploma or equivalent by the beginning of the Program. Students **must** present evidence of high school graduation or equivalent no later than the first class meeting.
3. You must answer **ALL** questions on this application and return it to the Franklin County Public Safety Training Center. **Application** must be **received** in the Center office prior to the application deadline.
4. You must complete a Virginia Western Community College student application and must successfully pass the COMPASS test.
5. A letter of endorsement on your EMS Agency's letterhead from the Agency's Chief, Operations Officer, or Training Officer **must** accompany this application. If not affiliated with an EMS Agency, you must submit a letter of recommendation from a work supervisor or college level instructor.
6. You must be certified as a Virginia EMT-Basic. **IF YOUR EMT-B CERTIFICATION EXPIRES PRIOR TO THE END OF THE COURSE YOU MUST RECERTIFY PRIOR TO EXPIRATION IN ORDER TO COMPLETE THE COURSE.**
7. A current VAOEMS approved CPR completion card for Health Care Providers must be maintained throughout the course.
8. Completed Medical Clearance Form, Deemed Consent Form and Agency Financial Responsibility Form.
9. Must successfully pass a criminal background check.
10. Any changes to the current Administrative Policies established by the Virginia Office of EMS will be applicable.

Student seating will be on a competitive basis utilizing criteria accepted by the Program's Advisory Board and Medical Director. Prior to placement in the course, candidate finalists will be required to participate in a brief interview process.

GENERAL COURSE POLICIES:

1. No more than **15%** of course work absence is allowed in this EMT-Intermediate Program for any reason. Students missing more than the maximum hours allowed will be dropped from the Program. This includes skill labs. All absences must be made up under the direction of the Course Coordinator / Program Director.
2. All Students must maintain at least a **70%** average to be considered passing and for student participation in any and all certification processes.
3. **NO** pagers, cell phones or other communications equipment are allowed in the class.
4. All students must consent to drug screening in a manner specified by Western Virginia EMS Council by the deadline established for the Course in order to participate in Clinical and Field Externship components of the Program. Costs incurred for drug testing will be the responsibility of the student or the student's Sponsoring Agency. Starting and completing any Clinical or Field rotations, and thus completion of the Program, is contingent upon a **NEGATIVE** drug screen for specified substances. Confidentiality will be maintained at all times in accordance with WVEMS Council's ***Student Drug Testing Policies***.

ALL STUDENTS WILL SIGN A WAIVER EXPLICITLY STATING THAT PROHIBITING A STUDENT FROM STARTING AND/OR COMPLETING CLINICAL OR FIELD EXTERNSHIP ROTATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED IN AND OF ITSELF A VIOLATION OF STUDENT CONFIDENTIALITY.

5. All students **must** document the enclosed health information listed on the Medical Documentation Forms.
6. All Students **must** submit a signed **NOTICE OF DEEMED CONSENT TO INFECTIOUS DISEASE BLOOD TESTING** form, along with a completed and signed **SPONSORING AGENCY ACCEPTANCE OF FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR INFECTIOUS DISEASE TESTING** form.
7. Students must successfully complete **all** aspects of the Program (Didactic, Lab, Clinical and Field Internships). It is especially important to understand that you must attain the **minimum required number of all** Clinical and Field "competencies" to complete the Program. Completion of the minimum required number of "competencies" ***could require additional hours of clinical and/or field rotations beyond the minimum hours required by VAOEMS Program guidelines.***

All patient contacts performed during clinical and/or field rotations will count toward the final number of contacts needed to satisfy the minimum EMT-Intermediate Program requirements. The contacts/ skills needed are as follows:

8. Students must complete all clinical and field internship requirements and **all** required competencies by the deadline established for the Program. Students not submitting **all required documentation** will not be allowed to sit for the certification exam and will be required to test at a later date, possibly outside of the local area.
9. All clinical rotations must be arranged through Program designated individuals. You will be given instructions on how to schedule clinical rotations in your program. Failure to complete hours you have scheduled without prior notification of the appropriate parties may result in your dismissal from the Course. **Any forgery of clinical hours will result in the immediate dismissal from the program and may result in decertification procedures.**
10. All field internship rotations must be arranged through Program designated individuals. Failure to complete hours you have scheduled without prior notification of the appropriate parties may result in your dismissal from the Course. All Field Internship rotations must be performed **with Program approved preceptors. Only previously approved and scheduled Internship hours and/or skills will be counted. Hours and/or skills completed with non-approved EMS providers will NOT be counted!**

Virginia Western Community College provides college credit for all EMS classes. As a result, you will be eligible for all services provided to VWCC students. **You must enroll to earn credit, and you must enroll prior to the start of EMS classes.**

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENROLLING ON-LINE AT VWCC

New students:

1. Go to www.virginiawestern.edu
2. On the menu at the top left of the homepage, click on **Admissions**; then on **Become A Student**
3. A menu will appear on the right side of the page, click on **Apply for Admission**; then click on the online application link in the middle of the page: <http://apply.vccs.edu/>
4. Follow instructions and enter the information requested. There are 5 parts to the application, and you must complete all parts.

IMPORTANT-in part 3, question 24 your answer should be **NO**, then select Upgrading Current Job Skills

5. After completing all parts of the application, click on submit. You will then be assigned a user name and EMPLID. The EMPLID will be your student number and all transactions with the college will require this number.

Returning students: If you have attended VWCC in the last 3 years or applied within the last year, you **DO NOT** need to complete a new application.
