PURPOSE: Franklin County Public Safety shall assure that appropriate, understandable and professional communications shall occur at all times between field staff and the emergency communications center.

I. POLICY:

A. The emergency communications system radio designation for the Franklin County E-9-1-1 Center will be “FRANKLIN” when communicating on radio channels designated for use for Fire/EMS dispatch.
